We have just introduced 'Friend-o-Leaders' here at St Joseph's. Through our URStrong program, older students are trained in a peer mentorship model, where they support our younger students with their friendships at recess and lunch. These 'Friend-o-Leaders' have a very clear handle on the URStrong core concepts, that is, the Four Friendship Facts, the Friend-o-Meter, putting out Friendship Fires and how to use Quick Comebacks when responding to Mean-on-Purpose behaviours. Other URStrong schools who've already launched mentorship models report that students feel comfortable in talking to other students about their friendship issues, which shows that peer mentoring has positive outcomes for everyone involved!
